Course Introduction

The course Introduction to International Esports Law is a four-week open course (every Thursday two hours online), offered by the Academy of Leadership Sciences Switzerland, Zurich.

The course is designed and delivered by recognized experts in Esports Law. It is being offered as an open course and can be attended by anyone who is, or aspires to get, involved in the industry of Esports-including Esports administrators, publishers, promoters' lawyers, Esports agents, current and former Esports players, among others.

Course content

The course covers specific topics related to Esports, including national and international regulation of Esports, law directly applicable to Esports, governance in Esports, Esports, dispute resolution in Esports, Antidoping in Esports, player contracts and other topics.
