Course Introduction

Leadership in Sports Law (Southeast Asia) is an 8-hour online course offered by the Academy of Leadership Sciences Switzerland (ALSS).

The course is designed and delivered by recognized experts in Sports Law. It is being offered as an open course and can be attended by anyone who is, or aspires to get, involved in the industry of sports - including sports administrators, lawyers, sports agents, or intermediaries, current and former athletes, among others.

Course content

The course covers specific topics on sport-related issues including an introduction into sports law, sport governing bodies, sports governance, sports integrity, anti-doping, dispute resolution, Court of Arbitration for Sports (CAS) and other topics.

Accreditation and certification

The Academy of Leadership Sciences Switzerland (ALSS) is an international education institution that offers continuing education, further education, and post graduate advanced education courses, workshops and programs focusing on advanced studies in Leadership and Management. The ALSS also offers short courses that are not credit- bearing, and do not lead to formal qualifications. He specializes in sports law and dispute resolution and holds a Certificate in Sports Arbitration from the Asian International (AIAC). Arbitration Centre Richard has served on numerous legal and disciplinary bodies, including appointments by FIFA and the Football Association of Malaysia to the Appeals Committee of the National Dispute Resolution Chamber (NDRC). He also serves on the Disciplinary Commission and Arbitral Board of the Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI).

Mickey Ingles is a Filipino sports lawyer and academic specializing in sports law, taxation, and gaming law. He is a faculty member at Ateneo Law School, where he teaches Sports Law and Constitutional Law.
